

Equipment Inspection and Maintenance Guidelines

What this Safety Talk Covers:

✓ The "Dos" and "Don'ts" to help ensure the safety and reliability of equipment, reducing the risk of accidents and downtime.

Discussion Notes:

- ✓ Discuss the outcomes of the "Dos" and "Don'ts."
- **Do** Perform thorough inspections of equipment before and after each use, following the manufacturer's guidelines.
 - Keep detailed records of inspections, including any defects or identified issues, and report them promptly to the appropriate personnel.
 - Ensure all workers are adequately trained in equipment inspection procedures and understand the importance of maintenance.
 - Use appropriate tools and equipment when conducting inspections to ensure accuracy and safety.
 - Address issues immediately. If any defects or malfunctions are identified during inspections, take immediate action to correct them to prevent accidents or further damage.
 - Adhere to the recommended maintenance schedule provided by the manufacturer to keep equipment in optimal condition.
- **Don't** Skip or rush through equipment inspections, as this increases the risk of accidents and equipment failure.
 - Ignore warning signs such as unusual noises, vibrations or leaks during equipment operation. Deal with these issues promptly to prevent potential hazards.
 - Attempt repairs or modifications to equipment without proper training or authorization, as this can compromise safety and void warranties.
 - Assume that all workers are proficient in equipment inspections and maintenance procedures. Provide ongoing training and support as needed.
 - Delay maintenance tasks, as this can lead to equipment breakdowns and costly repairs.
